Army Family Covenant reaffirms our commitment to Soldiers & Families

Soldier-Family Action Plan (SFAP) builds on Army investments in people, programs & infrastructure; making the Covenant a reality

✓ **ACSIM stood up an SFAP IPT to:**

- ✓ Coordinate actions identified by AI#2 Working Group
 - 7 Sub-Initiatives, 29 Supporting Initiatives, & hundreds of Tasks and Actions
- ✓ Develop metrics ICW G1 to measure output & capture outcomes
- ✓ Monitor execution of the plan and report progress

✓ **Funding Strategy**

- ✓ In FY07, existing Family Programs received an additional \$100M, making an immediate positive impact on Families
- ✓ In FY08, Army committed to fund \$1.4B for all Family Programs at all installations
- ✓ Family Program funding base increased to support the CSA initiative to enhance the quality of support to Soldiers & Families in the out years
